

#### RONALD WILSON LINDEMANN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

#### **Nominating Guidelines for Induction**

\*Begins 5 years from date of graduation

An athlete must be nominated by a coach, teacher or former classmate.

An athlete must be a varsity letter winner in two sports for two years or more including his/her senior year.

Accomplishments at HHS are considered primary to induction; i.e. All-League, All-County, All-Section, Winged Foot Award, etc.

Any athlete who has participated in only one varsity sport for two years or more and is recognized as outstanding by his/her achievements may be given special consideration for induction.

Post high school accomplishments may be considered if remarkable or admirable.

In the event that a nominee is not elected in one bi-annual period they shall remain eligible for reconsideration in the next election period.



#### **Winged Foot Award**

The Winged Foot was a distinction that rewarded women for their athletic abilities, sportsmanship and commitment to a given sport prior to the initiative known as Title IX in 1972, which transformed and revolutionized women's sports across the nation.

The award was created by Coach Ida Menne and conferred as follows:

- 1 An athlete was awarded points for each sport played;
- 2 Additional points were awarded if the athlete-

Played 3 sports in a given year, Competed in an Honors Sport,

Captained any of the teams and exhibited leadership abilities.

Although points were cumulative from year to year, acquiring sufficient points to merit the award was not easily acquired, and in general the recipient did not achieve enough points to qualify for this honor until her senior year. In its time, the Winged Foot Award was the equivalent to the status of "All-League" for men.

It started with one man's vision...

In the late '90s

Bernie O'Brien set his sights on resurrecting the long abandoned HHS Alumni Association. Bernie's idea was to restore the defunct association and redesign it as a non-profit, charitable organization with two clear-cut objectives. The first, to give each graduated class a way in which its alumni could stay connected; and moreover, to give back to the school and community that he so dearly loved.

His project was a work in progress for several years as he set out to raise contributions from alumni, friends and corporations to develop his plan. A new era arose in early 2000 when his efforts were realized and the redeveloped organization, known as the Hastings High School Alumni Association, Inc., was up and running.

#### BUT THAT WAS JUST THE BEGINNING

Bernie's next effort was to form a distinctive sports organization to recognize former athletes and coaches for their athletic achievements and participation in sports during their high school years at HHS. The organization would be a tribute to the coach he revered and felt had profoundly changed his life and that of so many others during the '40s and '50s, Coach Ron Lindy. On October 21, 2000, Bernie's plan came to fruition as 16 former HHS athletes were inducted into the sports association christened the "Ronald Wilson Lindemann Athletic Hall of Fame."

This celebrated organization has grown to include more than 165 members, whose achievements, determination, leadership and love of the game during high school were at the highest level.
