



Peter Noyes – Class of 1962



Pete Noyes was a three sport varsity letter winner at HHS in football, basketball and baseball. After graduation, he attended the University of Bridgeport where he was a three-year starting linebacker, co-captained the team in his senior year and was named to the school's All-Time Team in 1969. In 1965, Noyes was named to the ECAC Team of the Week vs. Ithaca College and won the team's Outstanding Sophomore Award.

After a very successful college football career, Pete started his coaching career as the defensive coordinator and linebacker coach at Bucknell University, serving from 1971-77. His 1972 and 1976 Bucknell defensive units were nationally ranked.

Noyes went to Cornell University in 1977 as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, and over the years filled a variety of roles, including recruiting coordinator and assistant head coach. In both 1986 and 1988, Noyes' defense topped the Ivy League and the East and was nationally ranked. Overall, his teams recorded 21 career shutouts and the team won two Ivy championships [1988 and 1990]. Pete's efforts were also recognized on the national level in 2003, when he received the All-American Football Foundation's Mike Campbell Top Assistant Coach Award.

For the last 13 years, Noyes has served as Cornell's Director of Football Operations and Coordinator of Football Alumni Relations. In 2001, Pete was honored with the Lou Conti'41 Lifetime Achievement Award. For almost 50 years, Pete has been very successful at every level in football.


Pete and his wife, Carol, reside in Ithaca and have 3 children; Jennifer, Justin and the late Ronnie.

MaryEllen graduated from Hastings High School in 1968. After graduation she married Chester Forrest and they lived in Hastings for 26 years where they raised four daughters.


