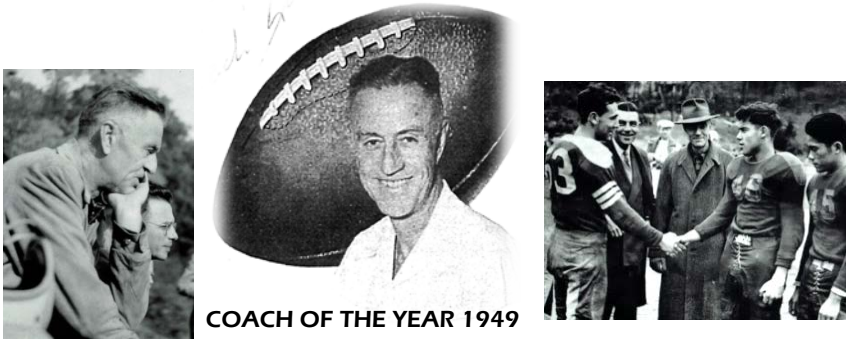

Ronald Lindemann was a popular teacher and coach during the '40s and '50s. Affectionately known as “Coach Lindy” throughout the school and Hastings community, he was involved not only with the athletes he taught but also with all students he came in contact. His encouragement and readiness to give of himself was an incredibly positive and lasting influence. He mentored many young men of that era, and helped them find their way, and expand their possibilities.

On October 21, 2000, the HHSAA dedicated its newly created alumni sports organization, the RONALD WILSON LINDEMANN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME, in tribute to this beloved coach and in grateful appreciation for his never-ending support, outstanding leadership and cheerful personality.

Although there were many remarkable faculty members who in their own way gave tremendous direction and guidance, Coach Lindy’s influence was an inspiration to all who were privileged to have known him.

## **RONALD WILSON LINDEMANN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME**

The purpose of this Hall of Fame is to honor and preserve the legacy of those who have excelled in the past and to inspire future generations of HHS athletes to achieve greatness of their own.

### **NOMINATING GUIDELINES FOR INDUCTION**

\*CANDIDATES MERITING INDUCTION BEGINS 5 YEARS FROM DATE OF GRADUATION.

An athlete, living or deceased, can be nominated for induction by any HHS graduate, teacher or coach. \*No self-nominations.

An athlete must be a varsity letter winner in two sports for two years or more, including his/her senior year.

Athletic accomplishments at HHS shall be the foundation for selection; i.e. All-League, All-County, All-Section, Winged Foot award, etc.

Any athlete who has participated in only one varsity sport for two years or more and is recognized as outstanding by his/her achievements may be given special consideration for induction.

Post high school accomplishments may be considered if remarkable or admirable.

The athlete must be approved by the HOF Selection Committee.

IN THE EVENT THAT A NOMINEE IS NOT ELECTED IN ONE BI-ANNUAL PERIOD THEY SHALL REMAIN ELIGIBLE FOR RECONSIDERATION IN THE NEXT ELECTION PERIOD.

### **HISTORY OF THE WINGED FOOT AWARD FOR WOMEN**



The Winged Foot was an award created by former HHS coach, Ida Menne. It was designed to reward women athletes for the sports they played, leadership qualities and respect for fair play, during their four years in high school.

The award program was based on a point system beginning freshman year and cumulative each successive year.

Acquiring the designated number of points to merit the award was not easily achieved – typically, the recipient did not accrue enough points to qualify for this honor until her senior year. In its time, the Winged Foot was equivalent to the status of “All-League” for men and it was the only honor designated for women until 1972, when the initiative known as Title IX transformed and revolutionized women’s sports across the nation.

**Bernard "O-Bie" O'Brien**

Class of 1950

"O-Bie" O'Brien was raised in Hastings and graduated from HHS in 1950. With help from his high school coach, Ron Lindemann (who was like a father figure), O-Bie attended Brockport State Teachers College, where he was a multi-sport athlete.

O-Bie always felt strong ties to Hastings High and wanted to do something to give back to his dearly loved alma mater. In the late '90s, he set out to restore the defunct HS alumni association and restructure it as a not-for-profit organization with two main goals: to facilitate an ongoing communication among alumni members, and to offer yearly scholarships to support future generations of HHS grads. His plan was a work in progress for many years as he set out with a small group of fellow HHS grads to petition for contributions from alumni, friends and corporations. It was an exciting time in October 2000, when their efforts were realized and the redeveloped association, now identified as the HASTINGS HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION, INC., was formally incorporated as a nonprofit corporation under New York State law – and operating as an active, member supported organization.

But that was just the beginning. O-Bie's next goal was to form a distinctive sports organization to recognize former HHS athletes and coaches for their outstanding athletic achievements during high school. The organization was a tribute to his former coach and mentor, Coach Ron Lindemann. On October 21, 2000, O-Bie's ambition came to fruition when the first ceremony was held, and 16 former HHS athletes were inducted into the sports organization christened, the RONALD WILSON LINDEMANN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME.

NOTE: This sports organization has grown to include more than 180+ members whose achievements during high school were at the highest level.

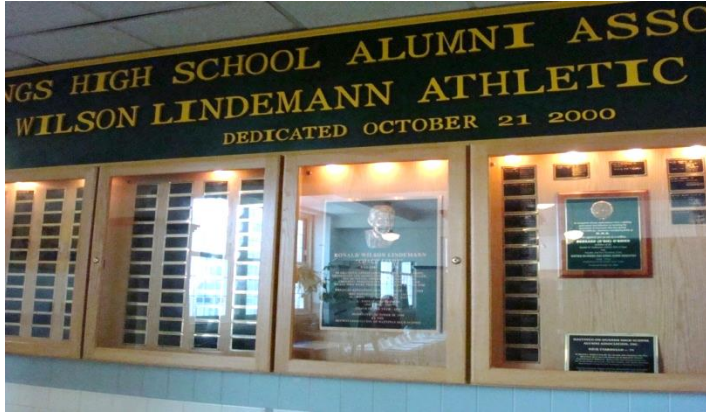

Nancy said, "Joe played ball for Hastings and after graduation came back to HHS to become one of the most successful coaches in HHS history."



After graduation, Joe attended SUNY Albany and graduated in 1984 with a B.S. in biology/chemistry. In 1985, he began his full-time teaching career at Msgr. Scanlon High School in the Bronx, NY. In 1986, he graduated from Manhattanville College with a MAT in science education. Joe's coaching career at Hastings High started in 1984 when he was hired as an Assistant Football Coach. In 1987, he took over as the Varsity Softball Coach and coached for 17 seasons.

In 1988, Joe became the Head Football Coach at HHS and held this position for 24 years, including 6 seasons as the merged Dobbs/Hastings Head Coach. In 1990, Joe was hired to teach 8th grade science at Farragut Middle School, and he continues to do so today.

Joe married Suzanne Jenkins (HHS '89) in 2005, and they currently live in Hartsdale with their 11-year-old triplets, Grace, Alex and Sofia.

Chip made both varsity baseball and varsity basketball as a freshman and played varsity ball for all four years. His talent on the playing field got him recognition as an All-County Athlete in baseball in his junior year.

Chip graduated from Hastings High in 1973, later graduating from Elizabeth Seton College with a degree in radio. At the time of his death, he was working in production for NBA.com

He had an encyclopedic mind for music, with a collection of more than 10,000 CDs and, of course, a love of sports, with a particular fondness for the San Francisco Giants.

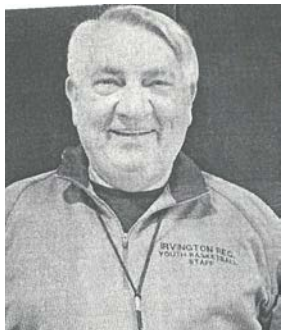


## WILLIAM "OTTO" OTIVICH – Class of 1966

"Optimistic, Outgoing Otto." Not much changed for Otto, as he was described in his high school yearbook in 1966.

This lifelong Hastings resident has never strayed too far from home. After graduating in 1970 from Manhattan College in Riverdale, NY, Otto began his teaching career at Irvington High School, where he taught physical education for 33 years. His extensive coaching career included 18 years as the Irvington Varsity Boys Basketball coach and 30 years as the Irvington Youth Basketball Director. His entire life has been about sports and kids as his lengthy and broad coaching career clearly demonstrates. Otto credits Jim Harmon and John Costello with getting him started.

In 1973, Bill married Patti Lemischak (HHS '69). They have four adult children, Billy, Melissa, James and Tracey, and six grandchildren. Bill retired in 2003, but this hard-working man shows no signs of slowing down. He remains an active member of the Hastings Southside Social & Athletic Club, where he was a past president for 4 years, the Hastings Little League, where he served as president for 8 years, and the Hastings American Legion.

## THE DEDICATION OF JOHN COSTELLO COURT



The late John Costello, “Coach Cos,” as he was affectionately known, was a teacher and coach at HHS for more than 40 years. During his time as the Varsity Basketball Coach, his career accomplishments were considerable. He was selected Section-1 Coach of the Year in 1969 & 1987 and compiled a career record of 457-255; winning four Sectional-1 titles (1969, 1975, 1980, 1987), and one Regional Championship.

In 1963, Coach Cos began an annual HHS Holiday Basketball Tournament, which hosted contending junior varsity and varsity basketball teams from Westchester and Rockland Counties. He ran the event effectively for 28 years, until his retirement in 1991. When the tournament successfully celebrated its 50th year in 2013, it was renamed, “The Annual John Costello Holiday Basketball Tournament.”

Cos was inducted into the Westchester Hall of Fame in 1997 and in 2002 into the Ronald Lindeman Athletic Hall of Fame. In 2014, he was inducted into the NY State Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame – an honor reserved for coaches who have significantly improved basketball and serve as glowing examples in the sport.

John Costello passed away in December 2017. His name is synonymous with HHS basketball, and his accomplishments go well beyond the basketball court. His easy-going nature made him a truly exceptional individual – inspiring many student athletes to follow in his footsteps to become future educators and coaches.

To all those who had known him, and the athletes that had the advantage of being coached by him, will be pleased to learn in January 2018 Hastings High School honored this beloved coach by naming the basketball court in the Cochran Gymnasium, “The John Costello Court.”
